Background

Development of MA1 Regional Pool minimum required thresholds and evaluation criteria

Discussion/ Findings

- Jordan Court project scoring was above average amongst the other applications for North County Regional Pool Funding
- The adjusted number of parking spaces would not impact the project's competitiveness
- Receipt and use of tax credit equity falls under the purview of the TCAC









Background on the Alameda Housing Portal

- In 2016, San Francisco launched a redesigned affordable housing application system with a new web portal called DAHLIA. 97 percent of San Francisco's affordable housing applications are now completed online
- The Board of Supervisors has invested over \$2.3M since 2018 in building a robust system that serves Alameda County residents and continues to refine and expand our portal, which launched and started posting listings in 2020
- Today, Alameda county collaborates with an internal working group (made up of city housing staff partners) and a second group of key Bay Area jurisdictions (City of San Jose, San Mateo County, BAHFA) to improve the scope and quality of the platform

Why Have a Housing Portal?

Providing low-income people and property managers with one-stop shop access to apply for and manage waitlists for affordable housing.





AC Housing Portal

An applicant focused / transparent system



Applicant Portal Increasing Access, Saving Time, Providing Transparency



- A centralized location is more transparent and accessible
- A common application saves time and complexity
- An online electronic application minimizes errors
- The online application saves user information for future applications (optional)
- Applicants can review the status of pending applications and lotteries

Portal Impact

- Measure A-1 funded projects are now required to be listed on the Portal
- Listings have steadily increased from 7 in the Portal's inaugural year of 2020 to 27 in 2023
- Applications per year have also increased dramatically from 19,626 in 2020 to 87,245 in 2023
- 2/3 of 2023 applicants are extremely low-income (<30% of Area Median Income)
- 38% of all applicants are from Oakland and the vast majority currently live in Alameda County




Doorway Regional Portal Update Digitizing Listings in the Bay Area

- Common capabilities and listings format
- Coordinate fees and timelines
- Potential to refer applicants across Counties
- Share technical development costs
- Shared advocacy and best practices
- Pool data to inform policy
- Increase platform adoption for regional developers who may have their own platform



Doorway Regional Portal Update Digitizing Listings in the Bay Area

- Regional Portal launched June 2023
- Currently cross-posts listings from the Alameda County Portal
- Includes listings from the 8 Bay Area Counties

Program Sustainability

Exygy and Eden I&R



- County approved new contracts in 2022 with Exygy and Eden I&R to continue management of the housing portal
- Contracts began a new phase separating maintenance and tech development from listings creation and platform management
- Capitalize on Eden I&R's experience with AC housing choices to add listings
- Improved responsiveness/processes for asset management
- Contracts expire August 2024
